I. CALL TO ORDER

A. Certification of Public Notice.

Mayor David Suarez called the meeting to order and certified the public notice of the meeting as properly posted Friday, January 13, 2017.

B. Invocation.

Pastor JJ Wicke, First United Methodist Church, led the invocation.

C. Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Suarez led the Pledge of Allegiance and Texas Flag.

D. Mayoral recognition.

There were none.

F. Roll Call.

Molly Vallejo, Secretary, called the roll, noting the absence of Mayor Pro-Tem Tafolla.

II. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Gail Wiegall Ortiz voiced neighborhood concerns over the conditional use permit issued for 610 W. 13th Street, stating the owner is not in compliance with the terms of the permit approved.

III. PUBLIC HEARING

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to open the public hearing at 5:42 p.m. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- A. To solicit input on behalf of Lynnette Rodriguez for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a daycare at 915 E. Sugarcane Dr., also being 0.37 acres S200.88'-E80'-W211' out of Farm Tract 58, West Tract Subdivision, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas.

There were no comments received.

- B. To solicit input on behalf of T-Mobile with Eco-Site represented by SSC to rezone 131 S. Pleasantview Dr., also being Lot 1, Rev. M. Perez Dream Acres Subdivision, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas, from R-1 One Family Dwelling District to B-1 Neighborhood Business District.

There were no comments received.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to close the public hearing at 5:43 p.m. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

IV. CONSENT AGENDA

The following items are of a routine or administrative nature. D. Approval of the renewal of the Professional Services Contract for Emergency Medical Services Director in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00 per year for a two-year term and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. (Staffed by Fire Department.)

E. Approval for the Mayor Joe V. Sanchez Public Library to advertise and solicit prospective vendors to submit Request for Proposals (RFPs) for internet access services within the confines of the Schools and Libraries Program of the Universal Service Fund (E-rate). (Staffed by the Library Department.)

Commissioner Noriega, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to approve the consent agenda items A through E as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

For the record, the following is the Ordinance:

ORDINANCE 2017-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 2016-31, APPROVING AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF WESLACO, TEXAS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2016 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2017, FINDING NEED TO AMEND THE 2016-2017 MUNICIPAL BUDGET; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, AND ORDAINING OTHER MATTERS WITH RESPECT TO THE SUBJECT MATTER HEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Weslaco utilized diligent thought and attention to the preparation of the 2016-2017 budget; and

WHEREAS, unusual and unforeseen conditions have arisen during the fiscal year which have, or will require, the expenditure of additional funds constituting an emergency expenditure; and

WHEREAS, Section 102.009 of the Texas Local Government Code authorizes the City to amend its budget in such a manner as to provide for emergency expenditures as an amendment to the original budget in a case of grave public necessity to meet an unusual and unforeseen condition; and WHEREAS, the City Commission finds the amendments in the line items identified in the attached Exhibit are reasonable, necessary, and for municipal purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WESLACO, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS. The City Commission finds the statements made in the preamble above are true.

SECTION 2. BUDGET LINE ITEMS. The City Commission approves the budget amendments in the attached Exhibit as such change is necessary to meet an unusual and unforeseen condition as the result of an emergency.

SECTION 3. BUDGET TOTAL. The City Commission further finds the amended budget line items identified in such Exhibit will not cause the total expenditures in the budget to exceed the total amount of estimated revenue.

SECTION 4. APPROVAL. The 2016-2017 Official Budget, adopted by Ordinance 2016-31, is hereby

reallocated, revised, amended and approved as set forth in the attached Exhibit.

SECTION 5. AUTHORIZATION. The City Manager is authorized to undertake action to execute such transfers in accordance with state law, and file, or cause to be filed, a true and correct copy of this Ordinance, with the attached budget amendment, with the City Secretary.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. It is the intent of the City Commission that each sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this Ordinance be deemed severable and, should any such sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section be declared invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, such declaration of invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not be construed to affect the validity of those provisions of the Ordinance left standing.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final reading.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. Discussion and consideration to approve the request from the Boys & Girls Club for additional funding in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00 for furniture. Possible action. (This item was tabled on January 3, 2017; Requested by Boys & Girls Club.)

Commissioner Noriega, seconded by Commissioner Kerr, moved to remove the item from the table. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

Mary Gallardo Lopez, Boys and Girls Chief Executive Officer, stated expenses for the alarm system at the new facility exhausted their general fund and additional funds for equipment and furniture are needed.

In response to Mayor Suarez and Commissioner Noriega, this is a one-time request; they are applying for other grants and the school district has contributed some furnishings. The City has funded \$50,000.00 already for the year toward programming and \$30,000.00 for the court floor. The City Manager stated funds are available. Commissioner Muñoz requested a quarterly report be presented to the Commission.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve the request from the Boys & Girls Club for additional funding in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00 for furniture. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

B. Discussion and consideration to authorize the solicitation for the Request for

Qualifications for Architectural Design Services for a New Fire Station and Combined Police Station / Central Fire Station. Possible action. (This item was tabled on January 3, 2017; Staffed by City Manager's Office.)

Commissioner Muñoz, seconded by Commissioner Noriega, moved to remove the item from the table. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

The City Manager recommended to hire one firm for the design of the fire station (phase one) with the contract written such that if satisfied with performance at predetermined benchmarks, the Commission may authorize to negotiate with the same firm for the design of the central fire and police station (phase two).

In response to Commissioners Noriega and Muñoz, staff will embed an exit clause in the request for proposals as well as the initial contract and negotiate discounted fees on the second phase because of the similar work. Commissioner Muñoz noted the potential to attract larger, more qualified firms, with the scale of work in two projects combined. The City Manager noted the other advantages to the City that it may shorten the time to design both projects and save money.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to authorize the solicitation for request for qualifications for the Architectural Design Services for a New Fire Station and combined Police Station/Central Fire Station as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Discussion and consideration after public hearing on behalf of Lynnette Rodriguez to approve Conditional Use Permit to operate a daycare at 915 E. Sugarcane Dr., also being 0.37 acres S200.88'-E80'-W211' out of Farm Tract 58, West Tract Subdivision, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by the Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

Mardoqueo Hinojosa, City Engineer and Planning Director, stated 15 property owners were notified and no objection received. Staff recommends approval as this is an existing daycare with a change of ownership. In response to Commissioner Noriega, the daycare is considered grandfathered; a conditional use permit is non-transferable.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve a Conditional Use Permit to operate a daycare at 915 E. Sugarcane Dr., as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- B. Discussion and consideration after public hearing on behalf of T-Mobile with Eco-Site represented by SSC to approve Ordinance 2017-02 rezoning 131 S. Pleasantview Dr., also being Lot 1, Rev. M. Perez Dream Acres Subdivision, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas, from R-1 One Family Dwelling District to B-1 Neighborhood Business District and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. First reading of Ordinance

2017-02. Possible action. (Staffed by Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

Mardoqueo Hinojosa, City Engineer and Planning Director, stated 12 property owners were notified and no objection received. Staff recommends approval based on the future land use map; the site is for a proposed T-Mobile cell phone tower which still needs FAA approval and a building permit.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve Ordinance 2017-02 rezoning 131 S. Pleasantview Drive as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- C. Discussion and consideration after public hearing on behalf of Ivan Garcia P.E., R.P.L.S. to approve Ordinance 2017-03 rezoning 1411 N. Westgate Dr., also being 0.9426 acre tract of land out of Farm Tract 146, Blk 179, West and Adams Tract Subdivision, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas, from R-1 One Family Dwelling District to B-2 Secondary and Highway Business District and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. First reading of Ordinance 2017-03. Possible action. (Staffed by Planning and Code Enforcement.)

Mardoqueo Hinojosa, City Engineer and Planning Director, stated sixteen property owners were notified and no objection received. This property was previously owned by the Texas Department of Transportation as Right-of-Way and comes in as R-1 zone; staff and Planning and Zoning Commission recommend approval.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve Ordinance 2017-03 rezoning 1411 N. Westgate Dr. as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- D. Discussion and consideration to approve the Final Plat for The Villages at Westgate Subdivision, being a 39.87-acre tract of land out of Farm Tract 131, Block 162, West Tract Subdivision, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas located along the west right-of-way of Westgate Drive and approximately 1445 feet North of Interstate 2 and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by the Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

Mardoqueo Hinojosa stated this a private development proposed of 86 lots for apartments and three lots commercial. Staff recommends approval as the property is already zoned commercial use.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to approve the Final Plat for The Villages at Westgate Subdivision as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- E. Discussion and consideration to adopt Ordinance 2017-04 to reduce a detention pond easement line by 66 feet on Lot 2, Bonita Homes Subdivision. First reading of Ordinance 2017-04. Possible action. (Staffed by Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve.

Mardoqueo Hinojosa stated the owner is requesting to reduce the easement from 126 to 66 feet and is proposing to install and maintain a pump to discharge into the City's existing system. Staff recommends denial, citing concerns about the risk of mechanical or electrical failure of the pump, particularly after any change of ownership; staff noted all property south of Twentieth Street discharges into this drain. Vince Ewasko, owner, assured he proposes to extend a 12" gravity line, install electric lift pump and maintain any repairs necessary.

Commissioner Kerr withdrew his motion.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to table the item. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

F. Discussion and consideration to approve Ordinance 2017-05, amending Ordinance 2016-26, codified as Article V Section 134-259 Designation of Truck Routes to include Bridge Avenue from Business Highway 83 to Witmer Street. First Reading of Ordinance 2017-05. Possible action. (Staffed by Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

Mardoqueo Hinojosa recommended approval to allow a truck route accessing the former City Shop area along Bridge Avenue and Pleasantville Drive and add a heavy weight corridor to the same. The City Manager clarified this action is two-fold: 1) amend the ordinance; and 2) request the Texas Department of Transportation to identify as a heavy weight corridor the approximate one-mile distance on Business 83 and additional fifty feet on Bridge Avenue; their administrative process should take about three months.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve Ordinance 2017-05 amending Ordinance 2016-26, codified as Article V Section 134-259 Designation of Truck Routes to include Bridge Avenue from Business Highway 83 to Witmer Street as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

G. Discussion and consideration to direct staff to prepare an annexation plan for the New Fire Station property on north F.M. 88. Possible action. (Staffed by Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

Mardoqueo Hinojosa presented two options to annex the property for the new fire station at Mile 11: 1) staff would prepare a service plan to annex a 1,000-foot strip on FM 88 from City limits at Mile 10 N and FM 88 or 2) staff would prepare annexation of right-of-way of a strip along FM 88 to property owned by the City. Staff recommends option 2 as there are no homes affected; this is proper as the City doesn't extend its extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve option 2 for the preparation of an annexation plan for the New Fire Station property on north F.M. 88 as recommended. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

H. Discussion and consideration to approve a Professional Services Agreement with

Montalvo Insurance Agency for Loss Control and Risk Management Services related to Workers Compensation and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Human Resources.)

Veronica Ramirez, HR Director, presented an agreement proposing two options: 1) a renewal to the original agreement with no plan or rate change at a cost of \$29,500.00 and 2) an alternate plan with an increase of \$10,000.00 that includes additional services in addressing questionable claims. Staff recommends approval of the alternate plan to improve loss control.

In response to Commissioner Noriega, Mr. Ramon Montalvo stated the additional services would assist the City in reducing exposure as a result of claims being evaluated, investigated and closed. In response to Commissioner Muñoz, Mr. J.C. Villafranca clarified that the additional fee allows for 165 hours allocated to review claims and conduct training, but as he is committed to a long term relationship, he will work beyond those hours as needed at no additional cost.

Commissioner Muñoz, seconded by Commissioner Kerr, moved to approve a Professional Services Agreement with Montalvo Insurance Agency for Loss Control and Risk Management Services related to Workers Compensation for the alternate proposal as recommended. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- I. Discussion and consideration to extend or solicit proposals for the 125 Cafeteria Plan (short/long term disability (UNUM), vision (Eyetopia), and cancer, accident, hospital indemnity, critical illness, with inclusion of flexible spending account (Colonial), dental and basic life & AD&D (Lincoln Financial) for the City of Weslaco employees for an additional year at no cost to the City, effective April 1, 2017 to March 31, 2018, and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by the Human Resources Department.)

Commissioner Noriega, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to approve.

Commissioner Noriega withdrew the motion.

Commissioner Noriega, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to extend one year certain 125 Cafeteria Plan products, including short/long term disability (UNUM), vision (Eyetopia), and cancer, accident, hospital indemnity, critical illness, with inclusion of flexible spending account (Colonial) and solicit proposals for dental and basic life & AD&D (current Lincoln Financial products) as recommended. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- J. Discussion and consideration to award the lowest and most advantageous bidder for Street Materials Request for Bid Number 2016-17-10 and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Public Works Department).

Pete Garcia, Public Works Director, recommended awarding Frontera Material Inc. for Hot Mix and caliche delivered on site; award CAPA/Upper Valley for cold mix materials delivered on site and

Asphalt Oil Express for MC30 Oil delivered on site. This recommendation represents the lowest and most responsive bidders for street materials from respondents. In response to Commissioner Noriega, staff stated the amounts differ based on delivery or pick up of materials; in some instances, there are not enough trailers on hand to haul the volume of materials, in other instances, materials are used sparingly.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to award Frontera Material Inc. for Hot Mix and caliche delivered on site; award CAPA/Upper Valley for cold mix materials delivered on site and Asphalt Oil Express for MC30 Oil delivered on site as recommended. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

K. Discussion and consideration to nominate a member of the Weslaco community who has made significant civic contributions and achievements to the Rio Grande Valley Walk of Fame as part of BorderFest 2017 and authorize the Weslaco City Commission to sign the nomination form. Possible action. (Requested by City Manager's Office.)

The Mayor stated Howdy Smith epitomized civic service, recognizing his service on the Parks Board, volunteering in community events and as a veteran.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to nominate Howdy Smith to the Rio Grande Valley Walk of Fame as part of BorderFest 2017 as recommended. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

L. Discussion and consideration to approve the renewal of the lease agreement with Weslaco Little League for use of Isaac Rodriguez Park Multi-Purpose Field and Minor Field and Concession Stands and Harlon Block/Sports Complex Field #1, Field #2 and Concession Stands effective February 1, 2017 through July 31, 2017 and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Requested by Weslaco Little League.)

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve.

In response to Commissioner Noriega, Mr. J.C. Cavazos stated reconciliation is in process with their CPA and would submit a financial report as soon as available, no later than February 15. The City Manager recommended producing a profit and loss statement and balance sheet.

In response to Commissioner Kerr and Mayor Suarez, Mr. Cavazos stated access to the concession stands was priority to begin registration on January 28th and Mr. David Arce stated the City contributes minimal maintenance, mowing and trash pick-up.

Commissioner Kerr withdrew his motion.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Noriega, moved to approve the renewal of the lease agreement with Weslaco Little League for use of Isaac Rodriguez Park Multi-Purpose Field and Minor Field and Concession Stands and Harlon Block/Sports Complex Field #1, Field #2 and Concession Stands effective February 1, 2017 through July 31, 2017 contingent on a financial report submitted by February 15, 2017. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

M. Discussion and consideration to approve the renewal of the lease agreement with Weslaco Softball/Baseball League and approve the use of the Softball/Baseball Field 1, 2 and 3 and Concession Stand at Mayor Pablo G. Peña City Park effective February 1, 2017 through July 31, 2017 and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Requested by Weslaco Softball/Baseball League.)

Ms. Elvia Rodriguez reviewed the financial report, submitting revenues and expenses for 2016 and balance statement for 2015.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to approve the renewal of the lease agreement with Weslaco Softball/Baseball League and approve the use of the Softball/Baseball Field 1, 2 and 3 and Concession Stand at Mayor Pablo G. Peña City Park effective February 1, 2017 through July 31, 2017 the motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

VII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 7:26 p.m. Mayor Suarez announced the regular meeting to convene in executive session. At 8:23 p.m. Mayor Suarez announced the City Commission had completed its executive session and reconvened the regular meeting as open to the public.

VIII. POSSIBLE ACTION ON WHAT IS DISCUSSED IN EXECUTIVE SESSION

A. Personnel - Discussion regarding the goals, objectives, and evaluation of the City Manager for the City of Weslaco as authorized by §551.074 of the Texas Government Code.

There was no action on this item.

B. Pending Litigation - Consultation with City Attorney regarding City of Weslaco v. Briones Consulting and Engineering as authorized by §551.071 of the Texas Government Code.

There was no action on this item

C. Economic Development - Discussion regarding Project "Rolling On" as authorized by §551.087 of the Texas Government Code.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to authorize the City Manager and Mayor to negotiate as discussed in executive session. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

D. Potential Litigation - Consultation with City Attorney regarding Balch Machine Company as authorized by §551.071 of the Texas Government Code.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Lopez, moved to authorize the City Manager and City Attorney to consult with a Bankruptcy Attorney and engage with him or her if necessary as discussed in executive session. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and

voting.

E. Economic Development - Discussion regarding Project Smile as authorized by §551.087 of the Texas Government Code.

There was no action on this item.

F. Economic Development – Consultation with City Attorney regarding Economic Development incentive programs related to Project PanAm as authorized by §551.087 of the Texas Government Code.

Commissioner Kerr abstained from discussion and vote on this item.

Commissioner Muñoz, seconded by Commissioner Noriega, moved to authorize an incentive agreement subject to a claw back provisions as discussed in executive session. The motion carried with Commissioner Kerr abstaining; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

G. Potential Litigation - Consultation with City Attorney regarding Tom Mason as authorized by §551.071 of the Texas Government Code.

There was no action on this item

IX. ADJOURNMENT
