E. Roll Call.

Norma A. Cantu, City Secretary, called the roll, noting at the time of roll call a quorum present.

II. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Jaime Castaneda commented on his recent events of incarceration by the Weslaco Police Department; communicated staff was not wearing face mask, transported when he felt not necessary and commented he was in an unhealthy environment.

Barbara Jean Garza, CEO Chamber, reported on ongoing activities that included marketing, advertising, campaign efforts “Shop Local” and “Weslaco We Got This” and was a member of the Regional Tourism and Travel Advisory Committee that promotes regional events and hoped funding for small businesses is considered under the CARES Act.

Jennifer Cardenas, 600 S. Border, thanked the employees of Weslaco for efforts in keeping the community nice and running smoothly; praised the commission for their service to the community; grateful for the park improvements done; asked the parks continue to remain open and hoped library services would open soon.

Edward Mejia hoped testing sites for COVID-19 in Weslaco will continue; thanked the commission for public forum during these circumstances.

Commissioner Pedraza, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz moved to approve Resolution 2020-24 re-appointing David Menchaca, Marco Garza and Randy Hall to the Drainage Advisory Board as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor was present and voting.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-24

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WESLACO, TEXAS APPOINTING MEMBERS TO THE CITIZENS DRAINAGE ADVISORY BOARD

WHEREAS, the City Commission passed and approved Ordinance 2019-23 an ordinance amending Part II-Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2 Administration by providing a new article; establishing Article XI. Drainage; creating Section 2-280 through Section 2-284; creating a Citizens Drainage Advisory Board;

WHEREAS, Section 2-281 outlines the composition of the Citizens Drainage Advisory Board which shall be composed of nine (9) members appointed by the City Commission, with the advice of the City Manager; and,

WHEREAS, Section 2-282 states the terms of members shall be for no more than two (2) three (3) year staggered terms for a total of no more than six (6) years. The staggered terms shall be determined at the first regularly scheduled meeting of Citizens Drainage Advisory Board. The City Commission will have the ability to waive the term limit; and,

WHEREAS, Members of the board shall serve without compensation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WESLACO, TEXAS that the following individuals are appointed to serve on the Citizens Drainage Advisory Board.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. Discussion and consideration on amendment to Republic Services waste collection contract to include debris removal during a natural disaster and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (This item was tabled June 16, 2020; staffed by Weslaco Office of Emergency Management.)

Commissioner Kerr seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez moved to remove the item from the table. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

Mike Perez, City Manager, recommended approval stating a fee of \$691.00 per load was agreed to. This is currently the commercial rates for a 30-yard roll-off container.

Commissioner Kerr seconded by Commissioner Rodriguez moved to approve amendment to Republic Services for waste collection contract as presented. The motion was carried unanimously; Mayor was present and voting.

B. Possible action. (this item was tabled July 1, 2020; staffed by City Manager.)

The City Manager recommended the items be considered individually recommending each department present their request.

Each department director merited to the commission the need, use and cost. Staff stated the primary use was COVID-19 activities and upon cessation of the pandemic equipment could be used in other city related business to include disaster declarations and assistance to other entities. The City Manager stated once submitted for reimbursement an item not eligible could be expensed out of the General Fund if directed by the commission.

Commissioner Munoz seconded by Commissioner Rodriguez moved to table. The motion carried unanimously. Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion and consideration to adopt Ordinance 2020-16 amending the Utility Extension Ordinance Codified as Article III Section 5 regarding the approval of a Utility Reimbursement Agreement and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. First reading of Ordinance 2020-16. Possible action. (Staffed by Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

Rebekah de la Fuente, Director of Planning and Code Enforcement, stated the existing ordinance was adopted in 1993; a section of ordinance vague dealing with the appropriate period to file a reimbursement agreement period nor does it outline the procedures of a fee schedule. Staff recommended approval to adopt Ordinance 2020-16 that would outline the appropriate time to request a reimbursement agreement.

Juan E. Gonzalez, City Attorney, recommended to table.

Commissioner Munoz, seconded by Commissioner Pedraza, moved to table Ordinance 2020-16 as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

B. Discussion and consideration of Ordinance 2020-18 for dis-annexation request from the property owner of 5000 S. Border Avenue also being the West 22.0 acres of Farm Tract 799 excluding the W3.68 acres for improvements 18.32 acres gross, West Tract Subdivision, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. First reading on Ordinance 2020-18. Possible action. (Staffed by Planning and Code Enforcement Department.)

The City Manager stated the property owner requested dis-annexation of his property; annexed in 2014; municipal services have not been fulfilled within the specified allotted time; has water, police, fire and EMS services but no sewer. The City Manager recommended approval of Ordinance 2020-18.

Commissioner Munoz, seconded by Commissioner Pedraza, moved to approve Ordinance 2020-18 for dis-annexation from property owner at 5000 S. Border Avenue as discussed. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

C. Discussion and consideration on presentation of the financials for the General, Water/Wastewater and Solid Waste funds as of June 30, 2020 and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Finance Department).

Vidal Roman, Finance Director, presented the financials ending June 30, 2020 for the General Fund; Water/Wastewater, and Solid Waste Fund; noting the General Fund days in working capital was healthy; Water/Wastewater expenses are minimal, and the Solid Waste Fund had decreased but should improve. The City Manager recommended approval to accept and file as presented.

Commissioner Munoz, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez moved to accept and file financials for General, Water/Wastewater and Solid Waste Funds as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

D. Discussion and consideration to approve Ordinance 2020-15 adopting a mid-year budget amendment and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. First reading on Ordinance 2020-15. Possible action. (Staffed by Finance.)

Vidal Roman, presented the budget amendments for the departments that were necessary as a result of emergency expenditures, overage in line items and COVID-19 expenditures (offset with grant funding.) Impact to the General Fund was \$447,276 less; Water/Wastewater Fund \$514,614 less and Solid Waste Fund \$52,846 less and noted a transfer to Weslaco Economic Development Incentive project not originally budgeted was included. Staff recommended approval.

Commissioner Muñoz, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez, moved to approve Ordinance 2020-15 adopting mid-year budget amendment as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

E. Discussion and consideration of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Weslaco and Hidalgo County Drainage District No. 1, Phase I Flood Control Project and authorize the Mayor to execute and related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Engineering Department.)

Commissioner Kerr abstained from vote and discussion.

Albert Aldana, City Engineer, stated Hidalgo County Drainage District No. 1 is applying for funding to the Texas Water Development Board's Infrastructure Funding Program for flood control. The project, if funded, has a portion of their watershed in the city's jurisdiction. A requirement for funding will be a Memorandum of Understanding be executed relating to the management of the watershed. Staff recommended approval.

In response to Commissioner Muñoz, staff stated the request for funding is just over \$31million for drainage improvements and no financial obligation from the City.

Commissioner Rodriguez, seconded by Commissioner Munoz, moved to approve Memorandum of Understanding with Hidalgo County Drainage District No. 1 as presented. The motion carried Commissioner Kerr abstained; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

F. Discussion and consideration to approve Allowance Expenditure Authorization No.5 for the North Side Fire Station Project as presented by Alvarado Architects and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action (Staffed by Airport.)

Andrew Munoz, Asst. City Manager/Airport Director, recommended approval stating this was a final credit to the contingency fund in the amount of \$576.00.

Commissioner Rodriguez, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez, moved to approve Allowance Expenditure Authorization No. 5 as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

G. Discussion and consideration to approve Change Order No.3 - Final Change Order for the North Side Fire Station Project as presented by Alvarado Architects and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action (Staffed by Airport.)

Andrew Munoz recommended approval stating the Change Order provides a credit back of funds not used from the contingency allowance and will close out the project in the amount of \$1,620,105.87.

Commissioner Rodriguez, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to approve Change Order No. 3 – Final Change Order as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

H. Discussion and consideration to approve final payment for North Fire Station Project to Tri-Gen Construction for an amount not to exceed \$162,010.59 and authorize Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Airport.)

Andrew Munoz stated this was final payment to include retainage for the waterline project for the North Fire Station Project. Staff recommended approval in an amount not to exceed \$162,010.59.

Commissioner Munoz, seconded by Commissioner Pedraza, moved to approve final payment to Tri-Gen Construction as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

I. Discussion and consideration to approve final payment for North Fire Station Project to Alvarado Architects for an amount not to exceed \$18,288.43 and authorize Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Airport.)

Andrew Munoz stated this was final payment to Alvarado Architects for services rendered for the North Fire Station Project. Staff recommended approval in an amount not to exceed \$18,288.43.

Commissioner Pedraza, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to approve final payment to Alvarado Architects as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

J. Discussion and consideration to amend the City of Weslaco's Drug and Alcohol Policy and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action (Staffed by Human Resources.)

Commissioner Farias seconded by Commissioner Muñoz moved to discuss.

Andrew Munoz advised the amendment to policy would include non DOT employees to be tested yearly; DOT employees tested twice a year; includes disciplinary actions for violators to include test refusals; sets standards for specific drugs and expends requirements for return to duty.

In response to Commissioner Pedraza, a zero tolerance was included.

City Attorney recommended to table for review dealing with policy of refusal by an employee.

Commissioner Rodriguez, seconded by Commissioner Muñoz, moved to table. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

K. Discussion and consideration to adopt the City of Weslaco's Criminal History Record Information (CHRI) Proper Access, Use and Dissemination Procedures and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action (Staffed by Human Resources.)

Andrew Munoz recommended approval stating in order to have access to the Texas Department of Public Safety data base an access policy is required.

Mayor Pro Tem Lopez, seconded by Commissioner Rodriguez, moved to adopt City of Weslaco's Criminal History Record Information (CHRI) Proper Access as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

L. Discussion and consideration on amendments and extension of July 10, 2020 to August 7, 2020 Disaster Declaration (COVID-19) and any reports related to such executive orders and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by City Manager.)

The City Manager recommended to extend the Disaster Declaration until August 7, 2020.

Commissioner Pedraza, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez, moved approve amendments and extension to Disaster Declaration (COVID-19) to August 7, 2020 as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

M. Discussion and consideration to purchase a 2020 Volvo EC300EL Track Excavator in an amount not to exceed \$233,206.00 from ROMCO Equipment Co., through Buyboard Contract #597-19, authorize a budget amendment and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Public Works Department.)

Commissioner Farias abstained from vote and discussion.

The City Manager recommended approval.

In response to Commissioner Muñoz and Pedraza; the city had purchased a used excavator about 3 years ago; monies are available for a new one and staffing for operation is in place.

Commissioner Pedraza, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez, moved to approve purchase of a 2020 Volvo EC300EL Track Excavator as presented. The motion carried; Commissioner Farias abstained; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

N. Discussion and consideration to approve Ordinance 2020-17 a budget amendment in the amount not to exceed \$233,206.00 and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. First reading on Ordinance 2020-17. Possible action. (Staffed by Public Works Department.)

Commissioner Farias abstained from vote and discussion.

The City Manager recommended approval.

Commissioner Pedraza, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez, moved to approve Ordinance 2020-17 budget amendment as presented. The motion carried; Commissioner Farias abstained; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

VII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 8:05 p.m. Commissioner Pedraza, seconded by Commissioner Munoz, moved to convene the regular meeting in Executive Session. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

At 8:46 p.m. Mayor Suarez stated the City Commission had completed its Executive Session and reconvened the regular meeting as open to the public.

H. Legal Consultation - Consultation with City Attorney regarding Christopher De Leon as authorized by section §551.071 of the Texas Government Code.

Commissioner Pedraza seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez moved to authorize the City Attorney to proceed with temporary order as discussed in executive session. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.
